RESTORING THE MIGHTY WURLITZER

INSIDE THE RESTORATION

David Peckham of L.A. Peckham and Son Pipe Organ Service has been restoring our Mighty Wurlitzer Organ since the project began in 2021. He has been traveling back and forth from his repair shop in Horseheads, NY to Shea's Buffalo Theatre to properly work on and restore components from the organ as per the Wurlitzer practice.



In the past year, Mr. Peckham has restored a variety of components including wind regulators, windtrunks, windchests, offset chests and manual chest bottom board primary pneumatic and valve systems. Wind regulators take the wind generated by the blower that is fed to them by the windtrunks and pressurize it appropriately for the sets of pipes they support.

Metal windlines connect the regulators to the appropriate windchests and subsequently feed the pipes. The primary pneumatic and valve systems of the chests are the mechanical controls for determining which pipes get wind from the input at the console from the organist.

Currently, work is being done in the main organ chamber located behind the house left box seat.

There are four organ chambers in total with two located on each side of the house. The chambers are stacked on top of each other with one chamber at the mezzanine level and the other located directly above accessible only via ladder.

More windchests, wind regulators, and windtrunks need work in the main chamber, but a good portion of work has already been completed.



The 12-note Salicional Celeste offset chest had some water damage as well as a peculiar leather overlay technique done to the original pneumatic material from 1926 that appears to be more of a quick fix done decades ago when thorough restoration efforts for the organ were not possible.

Second Generation Theatre Company, Inc. is a professional Additionally, expression mechanisms, tremulants, and the percussion instrument called the Chrysoglott, which sounds the same as an orchestral Celeste, will be getting restored. Expression mechanisms vary the volume of sound produced while tremulants manipulated the wind pressure to create vibrato effects.

AN UPDATE ON THE RESTORATION OF THE PEARL STREET VESTIBULE

Incredible progress has been made on the restoration of the south-facing wall of the pearl street vestibule. Our restoration team has been able to create a uniform structure of restoration appropriate material across the length of the wall. The unpainted plaster, the white areas you see in the photos, is still drying in sections of the wall and it is important that the plaster is fully dry before painting can begin.

Additional plaster work is being done to areas of wall above the pearl street exterior doors that also experience moisture damage.
