LEARN ABOUT THE HISTORY OF SHEA'S 710 THEATRE

Before Shea's 710 Theatre, there was the Studio Arena. Founded in 1927 by Jane Keeler, Studio Arena enjoyed 81 years as Buffalo's professional regional theater, moving from location to location over the years before settling in at 710 Main Street at the former Palace Burlesque.

Studio Arena produced many world premieres from such playwrights as Edward Albee, A. R. Gurney, Lanford Wilson, as well as introducing many of today's Hollywood and Broadway stars like Christine Baranski, Kathy



Bates, Betty Buckley, Glenn Close, John Goodman, Kelsey Grammar, Julianne Moore, Christopher Walken, and many more.
